Dear Senators Wyden, Duckworth, and Hirono:

The Military Coalition (TMC), representing more than 5.5 million service members, veterans, their families, and survivors, *thanks you* for advocating for \$32 million in Fiscal Year (FY) 2025 funding to sustain the U.S. Public Health Service Ready Reserve Corps (UPSHS RRC).

Despite having a rich history dating back to 1798, the USPHS did not have a reserve capability until the signing of Public Law No: 116-136, the *Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CARES) Act*, in 2020.

Endorsed by twelve former and acting U.S. Surgeons General, the USPHS RRC is part of a larger modernization effort to ensure Total Force readiness and public health preparedness.

While the *CARES Act* successfully established a preliminary framework for the proper and effective usage of the USPHS RRC, it failed to provide the proper “tools” for recruiting and retaining qualified talent.

This is why the USPHS RRC has not yet realized its desired end-strength, which presumably prompted the revocation of \$84 million in funding for the USPHS RRC via Public Law No: 118-5, the *Fiscal Responsibility Act*.

Despite this, the USPHS RRC has demonstrated its worth. Examples include augmenting the National Guard Bureau’s medical teams by delivering needed medical and public health expertise during COVID-19, supporting the Operation Allies Welcome safe haven and resettlement missions to ensure evacuees received medical care, and delivering no-cost healthcare to vulnerable populations through the Department of Defense’s (DoD) innovative readiness training missions.

Restoring funding for the USPHS RRC will maximize the medical capabilities and readiness of the Total Force, which TMC wholeheartedly endorses.

Thank you again for your advocacy. TMC stands ready to work with you and your staff to secure this funding and consider an expanded role for the USPHS RRC to further augment DoDs medical corps.
